NEW COULTRY ESTATE FORUM OFFICE OPENS

Councillor Dr Bill Tormey, in the presence of Mr Noel Ahern, T.D, Minister for Housing opened the Coultury Estate Forum offices on Wednesday 4th May at 7.00pm. The offices are based in the new Coultury neighbourhood centre, which has been provided as part of the regeneration project.

Coultury Forum, which liaises with Ballymun Regeneration Ltd and Dublin City Council on behalf of local residents, has an office in the new Neighbourhood Centre. It will be manned by staff and volunteer members of the Coultury Forum. The Coultury Forum is one of five forums, which make up the Ballymun Neighbourhood Council (BNC) who are the nominated body to represent the Ballymun Community in the regeneration process. The role of the forums is to provide advice and advocacy to local residents.

Another of the offices is being manned by Dublin City Council as a public office to take complaints and to give information and advice to the local residents. The office will be manned by Estate Management staff and will be

used by Community Development Staff, the Social Inclusion Unit and Sports Officers. The office will be used to hold meetings on matters of interest with the local residents.

The Coultry Estate office will be open from 9.30am to 1.00pm, Monday to Friday.

Two more neighbourhood Centres are due to open soon; Shangan Neighbourhood Centre is already under construction and construction will start on Sillogue Neighbourhood Centre later this year. The Coultry Neighbourhood Centre contains four retail units, a crèche, residential units and community meeting rooms.

Irish Pool Federation wins World Pool Championships

The Irish Pool Federation located in Ballymun recently won the World Junior and Youth Speed Pool Championships and the Junior World Singles Championship in Bridlington, Hull in April 2006. This is the sixth time the Irish Pool Federation has won at these championships. The event was well attended

by over 600 players mainly from around Europe.

The Pool Federation, in conjunction with Superleague Ireland, recently organized a major event at the Green Isle Hotel from the 11th–14th May with 120 of the top European players, plus 160 Irish players, playing from Friday morning until Sunday evening in the Professional Pro-Am Team and Individual events. The top eight players were past and present members of the Pool Federation with Wayne Neeson from Coultry winning the Super league singles event.

The Irish Pool Federation was formed in 1990 and started with 58 players. Today, there are over 160 members under 21 years of age in the organisation. The players are coached in the St. Pappin's Youth Club on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday by Martin Kirwan.

The Construction Workers Health Trust recent visit to BRL

It is well established that building workers do not enjoy as good health as white-collar workers. The principal reasons are:

1. Lifestyle
2. Smoking
3. Poor diet
4. Drinking habits
5. Stress

Since 1997 health screening on building sites has been provided throughout Ireland. Central to the screening philosophy are the confidential clinical tests, i.e. blood pressure, cholesterol, lung function, blood sugar and body mass index. All workers screened are given immediate results and, if necessary, referred to a GP.

To compliment BRL's Health & Safety Manager, John Rizzolo's commitment to raising the standards of construction health and safety, Brian Kinsella, BRL H & S Monitor invited the CWHT to provide invaluable early detection and free medical

screening for the employees of both the BRL and non-BRL construction projects. Nearly 240 workers attended the free screenings.

BRL wish to thank all the CWHT staff for their professional services and also Mary Woolhead for her assistance in obtaining suitable screening facilities.
