The Ballymun Music Programme / DIT Community Links were awarded the 'Dublin Airport Authority Arts Award' for the effective and ongoing collaboration with Ballymun Regeneration Limited for the Music Room at St Joseph's National School. As part of this award they received a cash prize of €5,000, which will be used to help fund the Music Programme.

St Joseph's Music Hall is the first dedicated practice and performance space for the Ballymun Music Programme, which encourages the personal and academic development of the children of Ballymun through music.

Neighbourhood/Parks Play Days

The annual National Play Day takes place on 5th July every year. However Play Days can take place at any time. Play day events encourage communities to make time to support children's play. The purpose of holding this type of event is to involve and encourage as many families as possible in a celebration of children's right to play. This is done by providing a variety of play opportunities that are simple energetic and health orientated and can easily take place in local parks, open spaces and neighbourhoods.

Play Days promote the many ordinary types of play, at very limited costs and encourage both parents and children to get involved in playing outdoors.

New Playground at St Margaret's Traveller Site

In May 2009 work on a new playground located at St. Margaret's Site was completed. The development of this new play facility which was funded through RAPID, is a joint initiative between BRL Play Development section, local residents, St Margaret's project workers, Dublin City Council, and Ballymun Rapid co-ordinator. As part of the design process for the new playground, local children and young people participated in workshops, that involved them in choosing the location of the play

Thanks to this new facility over 100 children and young people at the site and adjoining housing developments are benefiting greatly from additional play experiences that would not have been available to them otherwise. Schools take action

Global Action Plan (GAP) has recently completed its After Schools programme for this academic year with Ballymun's Aisling Projects. The four Aisling projects work with primary school children from all over Ballymun. GAP's work with the Aisling project primarily consists of organic gardening and planting, Fairtrade awareness, environmental actions and field trips to areas of natural beauty and interest. Fostering a positive and rewarding relationship between young people and their local environment is of vital importance in helping to create and shape vibrant and sustainable community.

St Joseph's Junior National School in Ballymun participate in Global Action Plan's 'Action at Schools' programme. This has resulted in a massive 97% reduction in school waste going to landfill in just 6 months. This has been achieved with the hard work of the Green Schools Committee and the support of Global Action Plan, funded by BRL. Action at schools is an environmental programme that helps schools to save resources and money through recycling and saving in their energy bills.

St Joseph's Junior School have had the highest rate of reduction in waste of over 300 schools across the UK and Ireland since the programme began in 1997, "it is fantastic that Ballymun schools are leading the way in waste reduction and in green schools initiatives" said Aoife Flynn, Youth Coordinator with GAP.

To mark Biodiversity Day in Ballymun, Global Action Plan, funded by BRL and supported by the Heritage Council Local Grants Scheme, ran an action packed event in the Reco Youth Centre. The day was a great success with appearances from Dale Treadwell known for

his appearances on RTE's 'The Den' and Eric Dempsey from 'Mooney Goes Wild'. During the day there were a series of workshops about mini beasts & birds and even one on how to make your own recycled bird feeder. Over 20 young people aged 8 years and over were in attendance on the day.

Construction Health and Safety complaints - who cares? BRL do!

Ballymun Regeneration Ltd has a Health and Safety team who address complaints relating to construction activities. On receiving a construction H&S complaint, BRL Health & Safety take the following action:

1. Record the complaint.
2. Investigate to identify who is responsible
3. Agree a solution to the problem with the Contractor

4. Monitor the issue to ensure it is being addressed
5. Call back the person who made the complaint to confirm what is being done

J.U.S.T. Jesuit University Support and Training

J.U.S.T. offers learning support and training for people from Ballymun preparing to go on to 3rd level education, and for those already enrolled in a 3rd level programme.

They aim to facilitate 3rd level education opportunities for Ballymun residents helping them to realise their potential in a real tangible way.

Participating students are organised into sub-groups and each sub-group is assigned to a tutor from the **J.U.S.T.** project team. Individual and group sessions are organised by the tutors according to students needs. Individual sessions are arranged at times convenient for both students and tutors.

Academic support programmes cover topics such as reading and writing skills for college, study methods, library use,

preparing essays and projects, exam preparation.

Each student is also offered personal support to monitor and help address any non-academic issues which may arise.

This personal support service is integrated with other activities to ensure that there is no replication.

Group sessions are run Monday and Tuesday evenings, 7.30-9.30pm. All sessions are held in the Ballymun Job Centre/LEC premises in Ballymun Town Centre.

This is a free service for Ballymun residents and support programmes for the new academic year will start in September 2009.


