# NEXT GENERATION OF LOW CARBON HOMES

inister John Gormley T.D, Minister for the Environment, Heritage, and Local Government, announced details of the next generation of low carbon homes in Ireland whilst turning the sod on the Emerald Project in Ballymun during the summer.

The Emerald eco Project is partly funded by Ballymun Regeneration Ltd and comprises of 37 houses and apartments and will be one of the most energy efficient housing developments ever built in Ireland. Some of the main features of the Emerald project will be, negative Co2 usage rating, solar panels and green roofs.

This is the first time that most of these innovations will have been used in a project of this size, and certainly the first time that most of these will have been used in social and co-operative housing.

Emerald will have a co-operative vision amongst its residents and partners (Cluid). The ultimate challenge of living in a groundbreaking eco building such as this is only a part of the way towards a healthier lifestyle. How the residents live and interact within this building as neighbours is the overall challenge.

#### **People's Postcard Project**

Carl Doran was commissioned by Breaking Ground to undertake a new work in response to Ballymun's emerging intercultural community. Basing himself within the Ballymun Farmer's Market and the Civic Centre in the summer of 2009, Carl offered to make personalised postcards for passers-by, which were then sent to a recipient of their choice for free.

Carl will host a one-day open culture event with music and refreshments for all the participants, friends, family and the greater Ballymun Community on Saturday 29 August, from 2 to 5 pm, in Axis. It will also provide an opportunity to see copies of the postcards made for the project.

#### **Another Sphere**

Kevin Atherton's pair of stainless steel hemispheres will be sited in two different parts of the new Balcurris Park in Autumn 2009. The respective hemispheres, and the subjects reflected on their surfaces, will be continuously filmed by two CCTV cameras, which will transmit the two images to a central broadcasting point within the park. There, the images will be juxtaposed and simultaneously broadcast, as one complete sphere, on a screen housed in the park.



# Creating space for young people in Ballymun

The new park and playground located at Coultry Green was opened in November 2007. Following it's opening local residents looked at the issue of providing social play and casual sports for young people/teenagers. Coultry Green 'Friends of the Park' comprised of residents living locally, in participation with BRL, DCC, BNC and Coultry Forum initiated a consultation process with young people to identify the need to provide a designated place where young people could meet and 'hang out' safely within the park. In May 2008 a 'hang out space' was installed in the park, relocation of trees created a space for soccer and an additional sports activity was provide by installing a basketball net. Funding for these developments was provided through the RAPID Playground Leverage Scheme.

This project clearly proves that consultation with young people encourages involvement and creates a sense of ownership and respect of local play and recreational facilities. By providing young people with their own designated space, the local community shows consideration and acceptance of this age group, making it easier for them to 'fit in'.

BRL would like to take this opportunity to thank BCON and Coultry Green 'Friends of the Park' group, in particular Janet Brazil, Eddie Rooney and Kathleen Leonard who took a special interest in this project and saw it through to it's completion. We would also like to thank the young people who were involved in the consultation workshops and hope that they will continue to enjoy this facility.
